

New Church Entrance

Our project has begun. After numerous delays, complicated by flooding at the rectory, the footings have been poured. Thanks to your generosity we have raised 83% of our Capital Fund. We hope to raise additional funds to cover all of the unexpected costs. So if you have not yet made a pledge please consider one today.

Flooding

Work is ongoing at the rectory to repair flood damage on the first floor. Sheet rocking, painting and new flooring is in the works. A new sewer line will be installed soon. After that work is complete we will replace the hot water heater and repair the boiler.

Two new sump pumps are installed in the back of the rectory. Plans are underway to design a new drainage system. However, until we have made all of the immediate repairs we have to wait to see how much this project will cost.

All of this work has delayed the work on the front entrance. Our goal is to get everything completed by the fall. However, we are at the mercy of four contractors that all have separate schedules.

COMING THIS FALL: *Connect*, a new curriculum helps preteens connect with God's big story through videos, Bible exploration, and hands-on projects.

How it works

The Connect curriculum comes with five Old Testament units and five New Testament units.

Each Connect unit lesson follows a three-part sequence:

See – Start lessons by watching an animated video that exposes a key biblical theme Explore – Use the Connect Bibles to read, highlight, and sketch as they search for passages that relate to the lesson theme

Make – Make associations between biblical themes and their own lives with activities and projects on the learner materials that get them creating, collaborating, and connecting.

Sunday School begins on September 12.

JOIN US for a six-week entertaining and informative series of films. Beginning on Tuesday, September 7, St. John's will offer the six-part series The Chosen. *The Chosen* is a television drama based on the life of Jesus of Nazareth, created, directed and co-written by American filmmaker Dallas Jenkins. It is the first multi-season series about the life of Jesus, and season one was the highest crowd-funded TV series or film project of all time. The series' creators stated that they had hoped to distinguish the new series from previous portrayals of Jesus by crafting a multi-season, episode-based story. The series portrays Jesus "through the eyes of those who met him."

Mark your calendar: **Tuesday, September 7 from 7:00 to 8:00 PM** Episode 1 "I have called you by name." In <u>Capernaum</u>, Mary Magdalene (Elizabeth Tabish), going by the name "Lilith", wrestles with real demons. While <u>Nicodemus</u> (<u>Erick Avari</u>) is touring the region, Praetor Quintus (<u>Brandon Potter</u>) approaches him demanding help collecting unpaid taxes. <u>Matthew</u> (Paras Patel) deals with the turmoil of being considered a traitor by his fellow Jews. <u>Simon</u> (Shahar Isaac) and his brother <u>Andrew</u> (Noah James) struggle with their tax debts to Rome. At a centurion's behest, Nicodemus goes to the Red Quarter to perform an exorcism on "Lilith" but fails, leaving him shaken. On tax day, Andrew is unable to pay, but Simon tells Matthew that he has an arrangement with Quintus. The arrangement is to inform Quintus about his fellow Jews fishing on Shabbat. Andrew disapproves, considering it a betrayal. Following a suicide attempt, "Lilith" loses hope for her condition, until she encounters <u>Jesus</u> (Jonathan Roumie), who calls Mary Magdalene by name, healing and restoring her.
